BIG CREEK FISHING LODGE JOINS THE COLUMBIA FLYWAY SHOW

Mr Howard Kem from Big Creek Fishing Lodge will be joining us at our show. He will have a display of old and rare hunting art items. He will be selling his collection of old duck stamps and art work. He might even have some reasonably priced steel shot shells for sale. If you are a hunting enthusiast, you know how hard shells are to find and how expensive they are, post Covid. If you are a collector, or hunter, or would like to start a collection; come and see what Howard has to offer.

Howard has donated a goose hunting trip to be auctioned at our Saturday evening banquet and auction. The package includes an overnight stay for two hunters at his Big Creek Fishing Lodge. The next day will be a guided goose hunt on his private property. His property borders the famous Big Creek River, where salmon and steelhead ascend in the fall and winter. You might even get a peek at some deer

and elk while you are there. Rooms at the lodge are available to book for fishing. He only charges \$25 a day to fish his private property along Big Creek. The Lodge is also a reasonably priced place to stay when going to Astoria for a salmon or sturgeon fishing trip on the Columbia River.

WATERFOWL GALORE

Check out Young's Bay as you drive from Astoria to the show at the fairgrounds. The fall migration has begun. You will get to see why the Lower Columbia River is such a famous waterfowl stop over and part of a rich decoy carving history. We were at the Clatsop County Fairgrounds and Expo making plans for the show and the



bay is just full of ducks, geese, white pelicans, and shorebirds. There were lot's of seagulls, or are those baygulls? I don't know, but it's a sure sign the fall migration is starting.

Get to this show, there is just way to much to see and do to miss it!

IT'S ALMOST SHOW TIME!

That's right folks, our show is only two weeks away. We sure hope that you have made your plans to be with us for the weekend. For those of you coming to the show here is a little bit of helpful driving information. We will have direction signs posted along Highway 101 near the turn off to the show. When you get to the Fairgrounds on Walluski Loop Road, you will see gate #5. That entrance is for camping. If you are coming to the show with a camper, you can choose one of the available sites in the parking lot. There are camping sites around the perimeter and a few sites in the middle of the lot. There are power and water hookups. No sewer service is provided. It's a very short walk across the bridge to the Fairgrounds entrance.

If you are going to the show, you will turn left at gate #3. We will have signs at these gates to direct you. If you are coming to the show to enter carvings, proceed to the front door and park there. This will be unloading parking only, so you don't have to carry carvings too far. When you get unloaded, just choose any available spot to park.


