This show has a reputation as the premier wildlife carving show and competition in the Northwest and one of the five top shows in the United States.

After 30 plus years in the Portland/Vancouver area, the 2022 show moved to the spacious 15,000 s/f building owned by the Clatsop County Fairgrounds and Expo in historic Astoria, Oregon. This move generated the largest and best show ever!

Astoria is on the banks of the mighty Columbia River as it enters the Pacific Ocean. Not only was this a fantastic site to hold the carving show, but the area is also a virtual playground of sites to see, beaches to play on, fine dining, and outdoor fun!

Astoria is known for its rich maritime history, fishing industry, camping, Hollywood movie site, and one of the last stops for the Lewis and Clark Expedition. Make your plans to attend the Columbia Flyway Wildlife Show and stay and play on the beautiful Oregon Coast.

The show focuses on hand-carved, textured, and painted wood sculptures of waterfowl, birds, fish, mammals, and Native American Carvings, in twenty competitive divisions. The addition of four categories in Artistic Creations (Caricatures, Relief Carvings, Walking Sticks/Canes, Pyrography) will bring additional carvings and talent to the 2023 Columbia Fly & Wildlife Show!

On Saturday, view the judging of all the carvings in the main auditorium and the decoys in the water tank. Take advantage of the free seminars and demonstrations. We have several World Champions and notable carvers judging, presenting classes and seminars to help expand your carving knowledge.

There will be a Friday all-day class with World Champion Carver, Del Herbert who will teach painting techniques on a Green Winged Teal Hen silhouette. There will also be a half day class on Saturday with Cindy Longhat-Adams, a Pyrographic Artist, who will instruct on how to paint with heat. Both classes required pre-registration.

Free seminars, on both Saturday and Sunday, will be available. The times will be given as the show dates approach.

This show is a member of the International Wildfowl Carvers Association (IWCA). We will be hosting the "IWCA" Style Decoy Championship, open to all contestants, for 2023.

Four memorial awards will be handed out:

- The **Byrn Watson Memorial Award** goes to the "Best of Entire Show" carving.
- The **Will Hayden Memorial Award** goes to the Best of Show chosen from all Intermediate and Novice carvers.
- The **Helen Foster Memorial** goes to the Best Songbird for a novice carver.
- The **Don Baiar Memorial** goes to the best 6" mini decoy "trader".

## Division O. Fish

The major material of fish carvings must be wood. Glass, plastic, or formed eyes may be used. Metal may be used for whiskers, barbells, fin trailers, and where strength is needed. Rough-outs, plastic plants, real rocks, plastic fins/tails/gills, may not be used. Entries for Miniature Category must be one-half size or less and must be 8 inches or less in every dimension for the fish. ## Division P. Artistic Creations in Wood

This competition is open to anyone. Carvings can be life-size or miniature. Ribbons for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Best of Division

PC. Caricatures - A portrayal of a personality or animal often in a distorted or exaggerated form. Often depicted without fixed rules for the purpose of humor, mockery or criticism

PRC. Relief Carvings - A carving in which figures or patterns are carved into a piece/panel of wood; includes chip carving

PWS. Walking Sticks/Canes - The walking stick/cane is crafted and often carved from its handle to the bottom of its shaft.

PP. Pyrography - The art of decorating wood or other materials with hand-burned design creations resulting from the application of a heated metallic point.

## **Division Q. Feathers**

Feather must be carved of wood. Can be a feather of any species. Quill, shaft, and down can be painted to emulate the feather you are presenting. Open, Intermediate & Novice Best of Division: Ribbons

## Division Y. Youth

Open to all carvers 17 years and under. Age is determined by how old the youth is on September 1, 2023. No entry fee. Awards: Ribbons

## **Division YS. Youth Silhouette**

Carving will be a Green Winged Teal Drake Silhouette. Entries made of wood 1" thick or less and may be life-size (maximum from 10" from top of head to feathers on leg) or less in size. Edges may be rounded, wing, and bill definition is permitted. Glass eyes are permitted. Should be realistically painted. It should be mounted on a dowel and simple base. **The pattern is available on our website at under Event Details - Youth Green Winged Teal Drake**. No entry fee. Age is determined by how old the youth is on September 1, 2023

## 2023 Featured Artist - Jerry Simchuk

Jerry Simchuk grew up in the Northwest where he began to develop his keen eye for wildlife and love of nature. Days spent fishing, hunting, hiking, and caring for a variety of animals on his family farm filled his days, while his nights were spent painting and exploring his growing affinity with art. The knowledge and sensitivity gained during this time would become the hallmarks of his realistic, highly detailed, fine art bird sculptures.



In 1993, Jerry found woodcarving to be the perfect medium to express his artistic talents. He was drawn toward bird and fish sculptures, and deep down he knew this medium would be most rewarding, allowing him the ability to turn his love of wildlife into an art form

Soon after finishing his first carved bird, he entered his work in the Boise Woodcarvers Show in 1994 where he took top honors in his division. Since his first competition in 1994, Jerry Simchuk has competed regularly at top-level bird carving shows around the country, including the Ward World Championships. He has received numerous high level awards for his wildfowl



and fish carvings, and his work has been selected to appear on the cover of Wildfowl Carving Magazine in 2007, 2008, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2018. As one of this nation's most respected and premier wildlife artists, Jerry Simchuk has been invited to judge many prestigious shows, including the Ward World Championships since 2004. With his passion for creating realistic bird sculptures in both wood and bronze, Jerry continues to share his knowledge and skill with others, offering seminars, classes and writing articles. Jerry finds it very rewarding to know he is helping others grow in their passion for this art form.

"Painting a Green Winged Teal Hen Silhouette" with Del Herbert, World Champion

Del has won over 150 Best in Show titles across the country and in Canada. He has also won both Ducks Unlimited and California Waterfowl Association's Carver of the Year title. At the Ward Museum's Chesapeake Wildfowl Expo Del has taken Best Contemporary Antique Decoy in the Chesapeake Challenge, and he has twice won the Best in World title in the Shootin' Rig division at the Ward World Championship (1998 and 2010). Del's work even appears in the Smithsonian Institution.



One of Del's greatest accomplishments is the ability to share his talents and techniques with the next generation. He has taught the skill of making a working decoy to hundreds of students, many of whom have gone on to successfully compete themselves! Del states that some of the most rewarding aspects of teaching is when his students go out and achieve awards with their work.

In 2016, Del Herbert was selected as a Living Legend at the Ward World Championship Competition.

"Painting With Heat" by Cynthia Longchat-Adams, Pyrographic Artist Cynthia has requested the class be offered with no fee.

As a self taught multimedia artist and creator of things, painting with Pyrographic methods offers unmatchable challenges and rewards. thus driving the ingenuity that leads me to a constant motivation of experimenting and learning; an everevolving process that is my growth as an artist and a human. The class will cover both simple uses to the more



advanced methods that can be used for carvings, decorative pieces, or painting. She will also demonstrate her newer methods with milk and a torch.

"The senses that are awakened in the textures and smells of painting with fire (pyrography) has significantly allowed me to "find my way" in art. As an artist and creator of things I find myself drawn to all things natural, with wood and other natural materials as my driving force. My art has included scrimshaw, watercolor, pencil, pen & ink, and woodworking on many levels from carving to making furniture, just to name a few. I love detail; thus, my work's passion is in photo realism. I have spent the past 17 years developing the skills in the techniques of this pyrographic media to finally reach my current level. It is time consuming, but the amazing rewards it offers are unmatchable, as I layer up my burn, working with a very low heat and a slow process and then lightly enhance with inks and watercolors."

## **Division H. Interpretive**

Transparent stain and texturing are allowed, but no paint. Glass eyes are permitted. Entries may include wildfowl and mammals. All entries will be judged as one division. Open to all carver levels. Ribbons for 1st. 2nd. and 3rd Best of Division.

## **Division J. Mammals**

There will be no restrictions on the size of the carving. All texturing techniques are acceptable and no restrictions on painting. Any form of base may be used for support or display. Best of Division Open: 1st \$100, 2nd \$75, 3rd \$50.

Awards: Ribbons, 1st \$75 2nd \$50, 3rd \$25 1st place gets first pick, then 2nd place gets to pick, then 3rd place. Others draw a number to pick. You cannot pick your own decoy. Open to all carver levels.

## Division DSD. 2023 IWCA Style Decoy Championships - New

Same IWCA Rules provided in Division D. Style Decoys - Open to all carver levels. Decoys must be made of wood, cork, or stretched canvas. Texturing will be allowed by rasping, chip carving, combing, scratching, stippling and flocking. No wood burning except as a cutting tool. Stoning or carving (no burning) will be allowed on the crest, tuft, or hood of any species of waterfowl with a crest, tuft, or hood as long as it remains sturdy and functional. Undercut areas, wingtips, tails, and necks must not be fragile. Feather groups may be simply carved (back, side-pockets, rump, and breast). Only primaries, tertials, scapulars and tail feathers may be individually carved.

## Division E. International Single Working Decoy Championships 1st Annual Championship

Can be made of wood, canvas, or cork. No detailed bills, carved nostrils, or nails. A slight mandible separation is permitted. Undercut primaries are acceptable as long as they are sturdy. Texturing is acceptable except for stoning or burning. A facility for an anchor line is required. Decoys will be placed in the tank bottom-up, pushed to submerge, and must self-right. Swans & Geese will be tested from their side. The test will be performed two (2) times. The final judging will be from twenty feet or more.

While working at OSU I taught basic woodcarving, Northwest Coast style; bentwood box making; Adze and crooked knife making; and design.



Jerry Poindexter - Focus on Novice & Youth Carvers - Sunday Artist Jerry Poindexter has been carving birds for more than 28 years. He has been a contributor to the Waterfowl Carving Magazine for 20 years. Jerry has done workshops and seminars throughout the Pacific Northwest. Originals can be found in private and museum collections and various auction venues. Photographic renditions can be found on numerous websites.


Charles Bergman's great-grandchildren will be part of the judging team.

## **Show Rules**

- 8. There will be Open, Intermediate, and Novice Levels in all Divisions <u>except:</u> Bench, Mini-Decoy Floater Trader, Charles Bergman Contest, and Interpretive.
- 9. The Columbia Flyway Show and/or Clatsop County Fairgrounds cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage to artworks or personal items.
- 10. Your signature on the registration form indicates you have read and understand the show rules
